END PJ PARALYSIS – take part in the challenge NHS 70-days, 1 million patient days

We are pleased to join colleagues across the UK in supporting the #EndPJparalysis 70-day challenge which seeks to achieve one million patient days of relevant patients being up, dressed and mobilising over a 70 day period, ending just before the NHS's 70th anniversary on 5th July.
